A Christmas message from Revd. Naison Hove:

Let me start this message by expanding on the advent ring and its candle colours that define the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ the King. The picture below of candles ring encapsulate the advent Christian season.



The four traditional advent themes for the four advent Sundays are:

God's people -The Candle of hope.

Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle we celebrate the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

The Old Testament prophets - The Candle of **Peace**

Peace is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at this candle we celebrate the peace we find in Jesus Christ.

John the Baptist - The Candle of **Love**

Love is like a candle shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle we celebrate the love we have in Christ.

Mary the mother of Jesus - The Candle of Joy

Joy is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the joy we find in Jesus Christ.

The white candle represents the birth of Christ. The flame of this candle reminds us that He is the light of the world, by accepting and believing in Him as our personal saviour, we will never walk in darkness, but will have the true light of life.

The following passages of scripture point to the birth of Jesus Christ in whom we find refugee from the ills of the world that have rocketed our livelihood with unprecedented problems world over. Jesus Christ who came shall come again and will be finished as it was finished on the Cross for our totally freedom in the kinship of Jesus Christ.

AND in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. Anthe angel came in unto her, and said, Hail, thou that art highly favoured, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. (*Luke, Ch. 1*)

AND it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Cæsar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed. And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judæa, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) (Matthew, Ch. 2)

And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where the Christ should be born. And they said unto him, "In Bethlehem of Judea:

I pray and hope that as we celebrate Christmas our hearts will be refreshed with the messages of hope, peace, love and joy as gather as families to offer thankfulness' for the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ the Redeemer.
